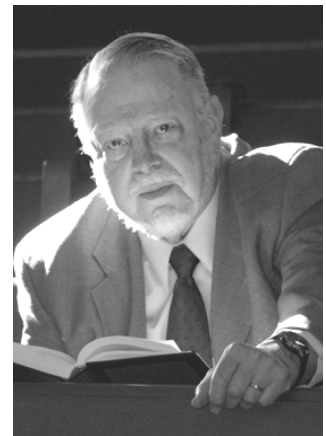
The Legacy and Promise of Unitarian Universalist Humanism
